This includes expanding our deforestation policies, publicly reporting on all four supply chains and sharpening our focus when it comes to comprehensive and voluntary disclosure that continues advancing our sustainable sourcing journey.

### **KEY 2019 ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

- 1. Expanded timebound deforestation policies to cover beef and soy, in addition to palm and paper.
- 2. Began reporting quantitative metrics on all four supply chains which were publicly disclosed in our most recent sustainability report (Aug. 2019).
